Current evidence:

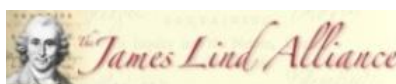
- National Guidelines – links to SIGN and RCP stroke rehabilitation guidelines
- Cochrane reviews and other systematic reviews – directly from the Cochrane Stroke Group database.
- RCTs - directly from the Cochrane Stroke Group

Ongoing research:

- Cochrane protocols – directly from the Cochrane Stroke Group database
- Ongoing RCTs – directly from the Cochrane Stroke Group database
- Other primary research – from the UKCRN portfolio of stroke studies

Future research:

- Uncertainties – generated and prioritised by stroke survivors, carers and health professionals in collaboration with the James Lind Alliance.
